Position Description – Summer Camp



TITLE: Counselor/Activity Specialist & Lifeguard

REPORTS TO: Village Coordinator & Waterfront Coordinator

SALARY: Entry Level Salary is \$360 - \$380 per week, plus meals and lodging during camp sessions

GENERAL INFORMATION: DuBois Center is the camp and retreat center of the Illinois South Conference of the United Church of Christ. Membership in a UCC church is not a requirement for employment.

POSITION OVERVIEW: Counselors live and work directly with small groups of 5-8 campers, providing leadership, guidance and supervision throughout the day and night. They lead a variety of activities, both traditional camp activities. Counselors spend 4-5 weeks living in a cabin with campers as their primary leader and 1-2 weeks leading program activities and providing background support for the camp community.

SKILLS & CERTIFICATIONS

Required:

- minimum age: 18 **and** a high school graduate
- current certification in Lifeguarding, First Aid, and Child-Adult CPR/AED
- successful experience working with children and/or youth
- after staff training, ability to provide primary leadership in at least three of the following and support in the rest: archery, canoeing, crafts, group building games, nature activities, outdoor living skills, waterfront supervision

JOB SEGMENTS

- Provide for the health and safety of all campers and staff at all times.
- Be directly responsible for a group of 5-8 campers.
- Working collaboratively and share responsibility for and leadership of a family group (two cabin groups) of 10-14 campers with another counselor.
- Supervise and provide guidance for campers in assigned cabin and family groups.
- Survey waterfront activities and conduct rescues to help weak or injured swimmers or boaters get to safety.
- Lead/teach a variety of traditional camp activities
- Share in the prep and leadership of singing, evening programs, all-camp activities and special events.
- Assist with camper and parent arrival and departure procedures.
- Provide background "support" for the camp community
- Complete end-of-week and end-of-summer closing procedures including clean-up and evaluations.
- Work collaboratively with other paid and volunteer staff members to achieve camp goals and maintain health and safety standards.
- Attend and participate in all designated staff meetings, training and in-service sessions.
- Create and maintain a positive image at all points of contact with the public.
- Abide by Illinois South Conference and DuBois Center procedures and policies.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

1. Cognitive and communication abilities to plan and lead activities to achieve goals for camper development.
2. Abilities to communicate and train campers and volunteers in safety regulations and procedures.
3. Visual and auditory ability to identify and respond to hazards related to the camp setting.
4. Physical and cognitive ability to respond appropriately to first aid situations or other emergency procedures.

DAYS OFF: All Counselor/Activity Specialists have a minimum of two days (48 hours) off every two weeks or one day (24 hours) off every week. You may request specific days off, but requests are not guaranteed.

SUMMER PROGRAM STAFF RECEIVE:

- + meals and lodging while in camp
- + a salary or stipend, paid twice a month
- + accident insurance, while on duty
- + intensive training

SEASON: Our season will run from May 28 through late July. Additional days after the regular season are available but not required.
